Gujarati Literary Circle helps students to develop their personas and become more socially and culturally aware by organising a variety of events. The following is an account of the year's events and learnings in the academic year 2021-22.

1. Natak Jo Ne Natwarlal:

Dated: 30th July, 2022.

Our first event, Natak Jo Ne Natwarlal, was organized on 30th July 2022. The objective of this event was to familiarize the GLC members and all other college students who attended our event with the ancient yet popular art form of Gujarati Dramas. We showed the famous Gujarati drama "Baa Ae Maari Boundary", starring well-known Gujarati actress Padma Rani.

Date: 24th August, 2022.

Gujarati Language Day is celebrated on 24th August every year in the memory of legendary poet and social reformer 'Narmada Shankar Labhshankar Dave.' The main objective to celebrate this day by GLC was to inculcate a sense of pride for Gujarati Language amongst its members as well as prospective members.

The Event was conducted by the GLC members. Many of the students participated and showcased their skills by speaking about the rich Gujarati culture, heritage and its cuisine. Dated: 17th September, 2022.
